PE

This half term the children will have their PE lessons on a **Wednesday (Swimming) and Thursday (NUFC)**. Please make sure that your child comes into school

Homework

Half termly homework challenges will be set for the children. It would be lovely to see what you have done at home. The children can bring their work into school, where it will be displayed, or upload things on Google classroom.

Spellings

Thank you for supporting us with this. The children will continue to be given the spelling sounds to find over the weekend and then we will work on them in school during the week. A test will then take place on Friday.

Reading

It is very important to continue to read with your children at home to develop their love of reading and to support them to develop their comprehension skills. It is also important for the children to read a range of books, in addition to the books sent home from school. In Year 3, reading takes place in a group and individual books can be changed when finished. Please ensure you make a comment and sign your child's reading record so that we know your child has finished the book.

Maths

Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS) - we will be continuing to do 3 TTRS quizzes a week. Please can you continue to support your child in accessing this and learning their times tables. We will be concentrating on the 4 and 8 times table this half term.

Summer term Literacy

This half term, we are beginning our literacy work by reading a portal story. We will then go on to write a story based on this. Later in the term we will be studying performance poems and using our Geography Knowledge to write a non-fiction text about Hadrian's wall.

We will be continuing to work on comprehension this half term and the children will be developing their prediction and inference skills. Please can you support your child with this when they are reading at home by asking questions such as -

What do you think will happen next?
Why?

Why do you think that character behaved like that?

Why would he be feeling that way?

Summer term Maths

We will start the half term learning about time. Our focus will be on telling the time to the minute on analogue and digital clocks - please can you support and reinforce this at home. We will also be working on shape and then linking to our geography work, direction. Problem solving and reasoning runs alongside all our work in maths. You can help your child understand the relevance of maths, and how to apply what they know, by giving them real - life opportunities e.g. cutting and sharing out food, measuring, paying for things, working out times and how long things will take.

Summer Term Topics

The Summer term topic in Year 3 this year is *Tracking Hadrian's Wall* Please read the topic web attached which will provide you with an overview of this half term.
